Adult Bible Study

Reformed and Presbyterian Christians are people of faith who are seeking understanding. From the beginnings of our Reformed tradition, Presbyterians have realized God calls us to explore ways the Christian faith can be more fully known and expressed. This vision has driven concerns for the education of people of all ages. Presbyterians have been big on providing resources to help us delve more deeply into Christian faith and the theology (talk about God) that gives our living tradition its distinctive heritage.

John Calvin (1509-1564), with Martin Luther (1483-1546), was one of the giants of the sixteenthcentury Protestant Reformation. Like Luther, he attracted many who were drawn to his theological understandings.

Calvin's vast amount of writings was joined by the insights and expressions of others who shared his theological outlooks. Like Luther, Calvin sought to reform of the church based on Scripture. Calvin's followers and their churches became known as the "Reformed tradition," which spread throughout Europe, into the New World, and now is global in extent.

The "Reformed tradition" refers to the broad range of theological views that followers of Calvin expressed. The Reformed tradition is "wider" than just the views of Calvin. Calvin's insights have and continue to be foundational for the Reformed tradition. Some later followers of Calvin, the "Calvinists" of the seventeenth century, developed his theology into more "scholastic" and detailed directions. Scholars debate the similarities and differences between "Calvin and the Calvinists." Without, a doubt, Calvin has been foundational to our Christian heritage.

In the Presbyterian Church, Calvin's thought is still a significant resource. His wide-ranging theological views have provided directions for churches through the centuries. His interpretations of Scripture continue to be relevant because he dealt with Scripture's theological message, which can speak to us in any age. Calvin's organization of the Geneva church with emphases on church discipline, and the care of the poor continue to inform church practices today.

I will be facilitating a six week course on "John Calvin: Founder of the Reformed Tradition" beginning Sunday, May 19th at 6:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall with a Soup and Sandwich Supper. If you would like to attend please contact the church office at 403-754-8211 so that we may order materials for you.

Like those who have gone before us in the last five centuries, we will find that Calvin's guidance for our Christian beliefs, Christian devotion, and Christian action can strengthen our faith and lead us to further understanding. I look forward to exploring the life and times of John Calvin with you.

Four Cents A Meal Sunday

On the first Sunday of each month we collect our **Four Cents A Meal Offering**. This hunger offering is collected on the first Sunday of each month. 25% of the offering benefits Hedgesville Loaves and Fishes and the other 75% is sent to the PCUSA for world-wide hunger programs. It is called Four Cents A Meal because it is suggested that each family contribute four cents for each meal each family member eats in one month, i.e. a family of four would contribute 16 cents per meal per day. 16 cents x 3 meals a day = 48 cents. 48 cents x 30 days = \$14.40 per month.

FWPC History - Looking Back The Sin of Dancing

Early Session records show where it was brought to the attention of the Session, that a woman member of Falling Waters Presbyterian Church was accused of dancing. The Session record states the dancing took place at a Falling Waters Community Hall. The session discussed this matter for several meetings, one member wanted to let it go, he saw nothing detrimental in dancing, but the rest of the Session felt otherwise. Dancing was seen as sinful and could not be overlooked. So after further meetings and discussion it was decided to summon the women before the Session to talk to her about this. She came to the meeting on Feb 17, 1871. The Session record shows she confessed to her error and sin. The record goes on to say she was sorry, and will try her best to never dance again. She asked for their prayers, and stated with their help and with Gods, "I will never dance again". The Session recognized her true repentance and accepted this acknowledgment. -Ron Hansen
