Pastor's Corner

HE IS RISEN! Hallelujah Though we won't be celebrating Easter until later this month, as Christians we live always with the knowledge, if not awareness, that we serve a Risen Lord. What do I mean by that?

What is the difference between living with the knowledge and the awareness of something? There is much we know in a logical, rational, intellectual way.

That kind of knowing is important and has always been valued by the Reformed Churches, especially by the Presbyterian branch of the Reformed traditions. And it is an important kind of knowing. Another kind of knowing is what athletes refer to as muscle memory. As my golf pro tells me, when I practice a swing (and it is important to do it correctly) the muscles get so well trained in the motion that it is easier to repeat each time. The same is true for any sport but it takes practice and working at it.

As Christians, how do we develop muscle memory in our "spiritual" muscles so that we instinctively turn toward God in all that we do; so that we live with an awareness of God and His holiness in all of life whether we are enjoying the sunrise, the new seeds sprouting or the even as we struggle through the difficulties of life?

Again to use the golf analogy, at the start of the season, I have a lesson after I have played a few rounds to identify the areas of weakness in my game and what I need to work on developing this season.....whether it is a new shot or fine tuning my swing. In my spiritual life, when I pay attention, I find that I am aware of those things I am letting go. Have I skipped Sunday worship with the community

telling myself I can talk to God on my own? Have I made room for something else in my life but don't set aside time for prayer or meditation with The Word?

One area, I personally have found recently that has helped me develop more 'muscle memory' is to be more intentional in my prayer life and specifically to take the time to open my ears and my heart. I used to think that the important part of prayer was getting the right words so God would listen to my wisdom about what was needed in my life or the world. I have come to know that the more important organ in the communication process is the ear! That I need to spend more time listening since God already knows me well enough to know what is on my mind. I find it is an empowering experience when I do this as it feels like there is more spiritual energy flowing into me than out of me as I let God tell me what I need rather than the other way around.

So as we enter this Easter season and encounter The Risen Lord once again, I invite you to think about and try to be aware with all your senses how you might need God to be more present in your life. Try also to be conscious of what areas of our community life together needs to have more 'muscle memory' developed so that we are strengthened together in our life in Christ.

FWPC History - Looking Back with Ron Hansen

Presbyterian Heritage Sunday has been set aside by the General Assembly of the PC(USA) as an annual day to celebrate, reflect upon, and learn more about the long and rich history of the Presbyterian movement in America. It falls on the Sunday closest to May 21, the date of the opening of the first General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America in 1789.

Our church here at Falling Waters began in 1745. On May 25 we will be celebrating our 269th year! Imagine that 269 consecutive years, as the old saying goes, "If these walls could talk". God has certainly blessed our church with so many dedicated and committed families to see to it that our church is still alive and well in 2014.

The Session has approved the purchase of a Commemorative Plaque listing the names of all the installed pastors that have so faithfully served God and the congregation during this time. The Commemorative Plaque will be of walnut, 18"x 12", with brass individual plates with the names of our 27 installed pastors beginning with John Boyd, 1794-1801 thru John Cushwa, 2006-2013. The Session has decided to ask if members would like to donate to the purchase of this special plaque. It will be dedicated at the May 25, Heritage Day Service.

If you would like to make a special donation for the Falling Waters Commemorative Plaque, please make your check payable to FWPC and mark "Commemorative Plaque" on the memo line. Checks may be placed in with the regular morning offering collection. For cash donations our familiar red bucket marked "Commemorative Plaque" will be placed on the small table in back of the sanctuary.




"Who is my Neighbor?"



During Lent we support Presbyterian ministries through our gifts to the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering. OGHS began in

March 1949, in response to the devastation of World War II. A Saturday evening nationwide broadcast asked Americans to give generously the next morning in their churches. A remarkable variety of national leaders and celebrities gave their efforts to the broadcast, and more than 75,000 churches responded the next day. This year the PC(USA) will roughly divide its money between three programs - Self Development of People, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and Presbyterian Hunger Program. The PC(USA) has received \$9 million - \$ 11 million for at least the past 20 years. Thank you for your long -time support of this offering. Your support has made a tremendous difference to people around the world who are experiencing need. We will collect our One Great Hour of Sharing Offering on Easter morning, April 20.
