Moving Forward

While spring seems all about freshness and renewal as new buds appear and new life begins to burst forth, this time of year seems to represent the fullness of life. Plants have grown mature and have given or are giving their bounty...that is, if they have survived the wetness of spring or the dryness of summer or vice versa.

Children return to school, another year closer to leaving home. At church we celebrate as they rise to a new Sunday School class. Adults take a deep breath and hope they got enough rest over the summer and are prepared for the onslaught a new school year brings.

This year the seeds sown in the spring when the Mission Study group was appointed, that have been nurtured by the hard work of the group under the leadership of Rev. Carl Howard, and that have been watered by the input of the whole congregation, are about to burst forth in the form of a report. The draft is finished and after some editing and minor revisions, the Mission Study Report will be presented to the Session at the September sated meeting.

After that, the report will be submitted to the Committee on Church Development and with their approval, the Committee on Ministry will recommend to Presbytery that you elect a Pastor Nominating Committee, usually referred to as the PNC. All these committee meetings will take place before the November Presbytery meeting, so most likely a congregational meeting will be held in early December to elect the PNC.

This process can seem cumbersome to those not familiar with the process. So let me tell you a bit about the theology of call in the Presbyterian polity (form of government). Our theology says that we hear God's voice through our own individual prayer life, through study of the scriptures and through the community of faith. Each step is guided by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, an individual could not come and say to the congregation, I believe God is calling me to serve this congregation, without that being confirmed by the congregation and the Presbytery. Nor does the Presbytery or any committee of the Presbytery say, you have to go to this church because we belive God is calling you there, which would be more like the Methodist system...again unless it was confirmed by the local church and the individual.

Each step is taken with prayer that seeks God's guidance through the Holy Spirit. For you Star Trek fans, we Presbyterians would be the Vulcans - accused of being the "chosen frozen...too cerebral and deliberate. Education and thoughtful consideration have always been held in high regard. You may see that as a positive or a negative and frankly sometimes it is both.

The other reason for all the steps and various committee involvements is, believe it or not, a pastoral concern. The system has been set up to provide help to congregations going through transitions sot ht various people and committees along the way can affirm the congregation is on the right track or can riase questions when they see patterns that might need to be addressed.

I cannot speak for the whole Presbytery or the committees of Presbytery but I can tell you that I have seen you, the church, here at Falling Waters, move through this time of transition with a willingness to learn and grow, a commitment to carrying on God's work and a whole lot of grace. You have much to commend you.

Looking Back-Looking Forward with Ron Hansen

Our Church has such a great and interesting history. A while back this question was asked, "Why has this little red brick Country Church lasted so long?" We answered that question then, as we answer it now. It is the people, the congregation, the members. They are devoted to the church. We have a long history of "devoted, committed members". They have seen the good times and the not so good times. When times were hard and difficult the committed members didn't just leave, they understood commitment and are here today.

Over the past 269 years FWPC has faced many challenges. It burned down not once, but twice. Those committed members rebuilt and our present church still stands today. The members, then and today, (some descendants of members long ago, some more recent members) remain committed. The members have been steadfast and resilient. That is why we last, we go on. We are not quitters. The devoted members are not just passing through. When they join they understand what commitment means to God and the Church. Changes and difficulties come and go when you are an active member of a church.

Now, as many times in the past, we face a challenge. We are in a time of transition, a process of finding a new pastor. By direction from Presbytery we are having a Mission Study. Keeping communication open is important. Everyone's thoughts and concerns are of value. Jumping to conclusions based on fears or anxieties can be destructive, however, asking questions when you hear a rumor or something you don't like can be helpful. For instance, recently there has been some anxiety about our order of worship. We have an inspiring Sunday Service with wonderful music. There has never been any intention of changing that.

We have been blessed with a very good and helpful Interim Pastor. Recently, Pastor Rose invited Rev. David Witt, a knowledgeable speaker on the Book of Order, to the August Session meeting to speak on the roles and responsibilities of committees and the Session in the Presbyterian Church. Elders and committee members gained an understanding of their proper their roles within the church, especially in church finances. Certainly our Church has changed in little ways and big ways over its long history. Just think back as recently as the 1969. Some wanted to build allpurpose room addition to our little church. I'll bet that was met with some resistance for sure, but they worked through it and look what we have - a wonderful, useful Fellowship Hall! Some changes are more recent. We have a reputation as a "welcoming" church. One change was repurposing the vestibule of the church as a welcome area before the worship service, to greet people. Another was the implementation of name tags. When people are involved, opinions are shared and questions are asked. We have always worked it out. That is a sign of committed and healthy church.

Change is inevitable. It can be positive or negative. It is up to us to shape it for our future. This is our chance for our church. Every member of our congregation needs a vision for our church, a Dream...
