Falling Waters Presbyterian Church was established in 1745 just south of the ford of the Potomac River at Falling Waters, West Virginia. In 1796 the place of worship was moved from the bend of the Potomac to Spring Mills. The present brick structure was built in 1834 after a fire had destroyed the original wooden edifice.
