Universal Day of Prayer for Students

"Get the word out. Teach all these things. And don't let anyone put you down because you're young. Teach believers with your life: by word, by demeanor, by love, by faith, by integrity. Stay at your post reading Scripture, giving counsel, teaching. And that special gift of ministry you were given when the leaders of the church laid hands on you and prayed keep that dusted off and in use" (1Timothy 4:12, The Message).

With these words, Paul is encouraging Timothy to not let anyone look down on him or give him a bad time when he's preaching and teaching. It's helpful to note that Paul would not have offered this advice to Timothy unless people were actually already doing exactly that. We can imagine what that must have looked like and how it affected Timothy. Perhaps there were a few elders in the church who were uncomfortable with the young man presuming to preach and teach them. It might have been difficult for some of the older church folk to swallow their pride and listen with an open mind and heart. But the reality is that since Timothy was taught by Paul, Timothy's teachings were essentially Paul's teachings. Paul is expecting Timothy to remember his mission and his role. He was expecting Timothy to walk in love, faith, and purity, so that the church members and friends would have nothing to complain about where Timothy was concerned, no matter what his age.

I imagine Timothy was encouraged by Paul's letter. I imagine he stood a little taller and spoke with a bit more confidence thanks to his teacher, Paul. A bit of encouragement can go a long way. And it's important for us to empower and equip young people to answer Jesus' call to that special gift of ministry they're given. It's important for them to be encouraged to keep it dusted off and in use for the building up of God's kingdom here on earth.



Sharing Some Thoughts

A few years ago, I was listening to two groups of talking heads having a rather irritating and lengthy panel discussion on the Muslim religion. One side said it is a peaceful wonderful religion and the other side said it is a violent hate filled religion. Being the type of individual to make up my own mind, I finally turned it off but decided I was going to buy a Quran and read it and decide the issue for myself. I read it cover to cover and some unexpected and surprising entries popped up.

The first one was Mary and the virgin birth is recognized. She is highly revered, but not as the mother of the son of God. They do not recognize the Trinity and Jesus is portrayed several times in the Quran as a messenger and prophet of Allah. Unless I missed something, the other thing about Mary in the Quran, she is the <u>only woman</u> named in the entire Quran.

Although Jesus in not viewed as the son of God, he is portrayed as having the ability to perform miracles. Keep in mind that Mohammad's version of the Quran was written about 635 AD. Of the many miracles of Jesus: healing the sick, casting out demons, walking on water, raising the dead, the only miracle put into the Quran is one not found in the Bible but found in the Apocrypha in the Infancy Gospel of Thomas describing the missing twelve years (in the Bible), of Jesus life. In this Gospel, Thomas describes an occasion where a youthful Jesus playing with his friends forms the shape of a dove out of the dirt, breaths on it, the dove comes to life and flies away. I was struck with the similarity of this story and the creation story in Genesis, where God forms man out of the dirt, breaths on him and man comes to life. I couldn't understand how even with this one example in their holy book, they could only present and believe Jesus is only a prophet.

I have read the Bible cover to cover and the Quran cover to cover. Now I do not consider myself as an expert on either one, but in doing so, I did arrive at a decision. When you see me in church, don't ask me what that decision is because I won't share it with you, but I do challenge you to buy a Quran, read it and make your own decision.
